## UPFH Reaches \$2 Million in Access to Services Provided

As we near the end of 2008, Utah Partners for Health will have invested over \$2 million to support access to healthcare for Utah's uninsured since our inception in 2003.

As the first, and only, organization to offer access to full primary care services and prenatal care to low-income, uninsured residents in Salt Lake County, UPFH has had a significant impact on the health of the communities of Magna, West Valley, and Kearns. Our mobile medical unit has also provided access to medical care for hundreds of underserved, uninsured individuals throughout Salt Lake County since it was launched in 2007.

Utah Partners for Health is proud to have helped over 10,500 men, women, and children receive the opportunity to be educated, screened, and treated for acute and chronic illnesses over the last five years.

In 2007 alone, almost 3,400 individuals received access to medical care

through UPFH funding. Two notable programs were started in 2007 for our target populations. The first program was initiated in July of 2007 and consisted of the addition of volunteer medical providers to offer complete prenatal care to low-income and uninsured pregnant women in Magna, West Valley, and Kearns.

Since its inception, the prenatal clinic has provided a total of 1,700 patient visits to over 420 women. Their care includes prenatal appointments, case management services, lab work, and postpartum care.

The second program initiated by UPFH in September 2007 was our new mobile medical unit. The mobile medical unit travels throughout Salt Lake County in neighborhoods and community areas that give our providers access to hard-to-reach, uninsured individuals who are in desperate need of primary healthcare. Volunteer medical providers

staff the unit and offer education, screening, and treatment referrals to hundreds of individuals that otherwise would not seek medical care until an illness was seen in an emergency setting. The mobile medical unit houses two patient rooms and is effective because it is based on collaboration with local community-based organizations, other nonprofits, and state agencies who help UPFH staff gain access to underserved populations in Salt Lake County who could not find healthcare elsewhere. To date, over 675 patients have been provided with care through the mobile medical unit.

Utah Partners for Health continues to make a critical difference in meeting the needs of Utah's working poor during the current nationwide healthcare crisis. We would like to offer a special thank you to all of the organizations, foundations, businesses and individuals that make our work possible each year.

As we celebrate five years of improving the health of our community, we are proud to look back at the successes and milestones that Utah Partners for Health has offered to Salt Lake County's low-income, uninsured, and underserved individuals and their families.

In 2007, 3,396 individuals received access to medical care through UPFH funding. A total of \$552,560 of direct healthcare services were provided to families in need

through volunteer medical providers and their staff with the assistance of UPFH donors. In 2008, we estimate to serve almost 6,000 patients for a total of \$1,015,000 in services rendered by UPFH sponsored medical providers.

The community impact that UPFH had in 2007 is remarkable. With a 76% increase in the number of patients served compared to the previous year, UPFH is in dramatic need of increased funding and support to meet the in ever expanding demand for healthcare for the uninsured, underserved, and underrepresented in Salt Lake County.

As we look forward to the close of 2008, we have new ideas to further transform the health of our community. Utah Partners for Health enthusiastically helps provide a unique solution to improve the lives of thousands of low-income and uninsured Utahans each year. We express our heartfelt gratitude to all who have partnered with us to make a difference and look forward to finishing 2008 with as much success as we saw in 2007.

## Utah Cancer Action Network Supports UPFH

For the next year, Utah Partners for Health has partnered with the Utah Cancer Action Network to provide increased education, awareness, and access for low-income and uninsured women in Magna, West Valley, and Kearns to receive cancer screening through UPFH sponsored clinics and medical providers.

The Utah Cancer Action Network is part of the Utah

Department of Health and strives to meet the needs of Utah's families to increase cancer screening, improve treatment access, and address cancer-related needs throughout the state. Through the funds provided by UCAN, Utah Partners for Health hopes to increase the number of women in our target area who achieve screening each year for breast, cervical, colorectal,

and tobacco-related cancers.

By collaborating with local community-based organizations and educating women through our mobile medical unit, UPFH will impact the long-term health and knowledge of hundreds of women who otherwise would not have access to preventive healthcare.

## Diabetic Specialist Hans Rayner, P.A.-C.

Hans Rayner enjoys challenges. Hans at one time specialized in Tort and Medical Law with an emphasis on wound ballistics research.

Hans has published 4 medical/legal articles on Wound Ballistics in professional journals.

The desire to care for people brought Hans back to the practice of medicine. He now practices family medicine in Magna, Utah.

Hans' specialty is difficult diabetic patients, and the word is getting out. Hans regularly receives referrals from hospitals and other providers to establish man-

aged care for high risk diabetic patients. Hans is trained on all aspects of diabetic medicine including insulin management, pump therapy, and continuous blood glucose monitoring.

Hans has taken several patients seen through the mobile clinic with glucose levels over 485. Today those patients continue to do well under PA Rayner's care.

Hans is looking forward to beginning a diabetic consulting clinic starting this December. The clinic will allow Hans to serve a greater number of low-income, uninsured, and poorly



controlled diabetics. "I have a true passion to care for diabetics to allow them to have a full life," stated Hans.

# Your \$1.00 Donation Is Leveraged to \$5.10 in Healthcare

Utah Partners for Health provides funding for the provision of medical and ancillary services to the underserved, uninsured, and those in need.

Our healthcare model is unique because we work within for-profit healthcare clinics, and therefore do not have to pay for buildings, supplies, utilities or staff.

We are then able to leverage our donations to more than \$5.10 in healthcare services provided for every \$1.00 donated.

The healthcare clinics that we provide funding to are open seven days a week and allow access to care on a same day or next day basis.



## Susan G. Komen Grant

The Susan G. Komen Foundation Salt Lake City Affiliate has provided over \$34,000 to UPFH over the last year to increase breast health awareness and screening for women in Magna, West Valley, and Kearns who do not have other access to healthcare. Over the course of the 18-month grant, over 800 women are expected to be screened, with follow-up care and referrals available to those who have abnormal results.

Utah Partners for Health is grateful for the longstanding relationship we have with the Susan G. Komen Foundation and their ongoing support of uninsured women in Salt Lake County. Funding from the Komen Foundation comes directly from donations raised at the annual *Race for the Cure* event held in Salt Lake City in May each year.

As the number of uninsured families in Utah continues to increase, UPFH is proud to partner with organizations such as this who are also striving to improve the health of our community one woman at a time.

## American Express Donates

Utah Partners for Health would like to thank the American Express Center for Community Development for their generous donation of \$30,000 to support UPFH programs once again this year.

Many of these funds will be used to support UPFH's mobile medical unit, which travels throughout Salt Lake County providing access to healthcare for uninsured and underserved populations. Other funds will be used to support UPFH's prenatal clinic which serves hundreds of pregnant women in Magna, West Valley, and Kearns who would otherwise not have access to prenatal care within their own communities.

In September, 2007, American Express Center for Community Development was awarded the first ever Utah Partners for Health "Partner of the Year" award at our 5th annual fundraiser held at the Utah Cultural Celebration Center. Two hundred people were on hand, including Salt Lake Mayor Peter Corroon, Councilman Jim Bradley, Utah Department of Health Executive Director, David Sundwall, M.D., and Utah House of Representatives Larry Wiley.

A special thanks goes out to Jane Shock from American Express for accepting the award and continuing to work with Utah Partners for Health each year. We look forward to a wonderful partnership with American Express for many more years to come.

#### UPFH MISSION

To provide access to healthcare for those in need.

#### OUR CHALLENGE

To deliver health care to the growing number of underserved, uninsured, and underrepresented who do not qualify for federal or state health care programs.

#### OUR TARGET POPULATION

Young families, single parents, the elderly, immigrants, and other medically underserved, uninsured, or low income individuals. In many cases, these are our neighbors, friends, and others in the community who are caught in the gap of not having insurance and therefore avoid seeking health care.

## Services Funded Through Utah Partners for Health

Utah Partners for Health provides funding to increase access to healthcare for low-income and uninsured individuals in Magna, West Valley, and Kearns. UPFH also provides funding for a mobile medical unit that increases health-care access for patients throughout Salt Lake County. UPFH helps fund the following services for those in need:

- Acute care – Illness, Infection, Fractures, Lacerations, Etc.
- Chronic illness care – Diabetes, Hypertension, etc.
- Mental illness care – Bipolar, ADHD, Depression, Anxiety, Etc.
- Preventive Care - Breast Exams,

- Dental Care - Urgent Dental Needs for Children
- Eye Care - Medical Referrals to an Eye Doctor and Vision Care for Children
- Prenatal Care
- Mobile Medical Care
- Counseling Services

- Ultra Sound
- Echocardiogram
- Pharmaceutical Assistance
- Referral Service
